MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Santiago High School Instrumental Music Program is to effectively build a high quality, well-balanced and exciting program that uniquely meets the creative needs of the band and colorguard student.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As a member of The BOSS, you are almost constantly in the spotlight of our school and community. Because of the number of public performances in and out of the local area, each and every member is expected to conform to the highest standards of personal behavior in all rehearsals and performances. All school rules will be in effect and will be strictly adhered to during each and every rehearsal and performance. Noncompliance may result in automatic dismissal from the organization and/or suspension from school.

GUIDELINES FOR BEHAVIOR

The main guidelines for behavior for all rehearsals and performances are:

- 1) A student may not do anything that will keep the teacher from teaching.
- 2) A student may not do anything that will keep another student from learning.
- 3) A student may not do anything that will in any way interfere with the personal rights of any other student.
- 4) Listen carefully to the director at all times.
- 5) Follow the instructions of the director THE FIRST TIME!!!

In addition, please:

- 1) Come to rehearsal prepared to participate and learn! This includes making sure that you bring your instrument, music, black three-ring binder, pencil, pencil holder, page protectors, and notebook to class every day. Your instrument should be kept in good playing condition and you must have the necessary reeds, oils, etc. at all times.
- 2) There will be no gum, food, soft drinks, etc. in rehearsals.
- 3) Raise your hand to ask a question. This keeps the rehearsal running smoothly.
- 4) Be on time for all rehearsals and performances. EARLY=ON TIME
 ON TIME= LATE

ATTENDANCE

Because band and colorguard are by nature a <u>performing</u> art, attendance at performances and rehearsals outside of our regular class time will be <u>required</u> of all students. Enclosed is a calendar of events for the school year. Failure to appear at any scheduled rehearsal or performance without proper excuse will result in a lower grade for that grading period. It is unfair to the band as a whole to suffer because of the absence of an individual.

In general, absences without prior notice from band activities will only be considered excused for the following reasons:

1) Personal illness 2) Death in the family

In both cases, the directors should be contacted as soon as possible and a note must be presented from a parent or legal guardian on the day the student returns to class.

Although we plan our calendar very carefully, some scheduling conflicts may be inevitable. If you must miss a rehearsal or a performance due to a wedding, graduation ceremony, special religious event, etc., this must be excused by the <u>directors more than two weeks in advance</u>. Students must notify the directors of any such conflict in writing and make your intentions known as soon as possible. A written assignment, due within two weeks after the performance, may be required in lieu of the performance.

Absences will also be considered excused for family emergencies involving serious injury (i.e. automobile accidents, etc.). The student should present a note to the directors upon returning to class.

Part-time jobs or "work", have never been and never will be an acceptable excuse for missing class, rehearsals, or performances as they are graded curricular assignments. Students are strongly encouraged to be regular in their attendance in band and colorguard for all classes. Please review Santiago's school attendance policy.

BAND AND COLORGUARD BOOSTERS

The Booster Organization is an incorporated non-profit organization made up of parents and other interested parties whose sole purpose is to support the Santiago band and colorguard program and their activities. In addition to providing the financial and technical support, which is vital to our program, they are often asked to take on supervisory roles. When acting as chaperones or sponsors, boosters will be treated with the same courtesy, deference, and respect accorded the directors or any other school officials. Failure to do so will result in strict disciplinary action. REMEMBER: Without the Santiago Band and Colorguard Boosters, there would be no BOSS program.

BAND COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

CONCERT BAND

The Concert Band is a yearlong band class open to all students that have at least one year of experience or the recommendation of the director. These classes will focus primarily on performance skills, including music reading, rehearsal procedures, aural discrimination skills, non-verbal communication skills, and analytical and problem-solving skills relating to artistic performance.

SYMPHONIC BAND

The Symphonic Band is an intermediate level performance ensemble. Placement is by the directors' recommendation. Emphasis will be on the preparation and performance of appropriate concert level material. Classes will focus on advancement on student's musical instrument and general knowledge.

SYMPHONIC WINDS

The Symphonic Winds is an advanced performance ensemble. Placement is by the directors' recommendation. Emphasis will be on the preparation and performance of advanced wind ensemble/concert band literature.

FESTIVAL WINDS

The Festival Winds is Santiago's most advanced performance ensemble. Placement is by the directors' recommendation. Emphasis will be on the preparation and performance of some of the finest, most significant works composed for the wind ensemble/concert band medium. Students will find this class to be musically challenging and a most rewarding experience.

Dress for these ensembles is as follows: (acquired through the band boosters)

Males: Tux pants Females: Black concert dress

Tux shirt Black shoes (provided by student)

Black bow tie & cummerbund

Black shoes and socks (provided by student)

JAZZ BANDS

The Jazz Bands are advanced performing groups focusing on the many different styles of jazz music with emphasis on improvisation as well as ensemble performance. Students must audition prior to enrollment. Instrumentation is limited to saxes, trumpets, trombones, piano, bass, guitar, and percussion. All students must be concurrently enrolled in Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Symphonic Winds or Festival Winds. The Jazz Bands will perform at school and civic events as well as concerts and jazz festivals. Concert dress will be designated by the directors.

MARCHING BAND

The primary focus of this unit will be to provide halftime entertainment at home football games and to perform in parade competitions. Rehearsals will be held on Thursday afternoon from 3:30 pm – 6:30 pm throughout our competitive season and are part of the student's grade. In addition, hours spent in marching band rehearsals and performances count towards band students' first semester P.E. credit. YOUR PRESENCE AT EACH AND EVERY REHEARSAL IS VITAL TO THE SUCCESS OF EVERY PERFORMANCE!!!

COLORGUARD

The BOSS Colorguard: provides the visual component for the marching band field show and parade competitions during the fall season. Using dance, flags, and other visual props, guard members interpret the music for the eyes of the audience. Following the fall season, the BOSS Colorguard will participate in winter guard. Winter guard is the sport of indoor color guard, which is a combination of the use of flags, sabers, mock rifles, and other equipment, as well as dance and other interpretive movement. YOUR PRESENCE AT EACH AND EVERY REHEARSAL IS VITAL TO THE SUCCESS OF EVERY PERFORMANCE AS WELL AS THE BOSS COLORGUARD AS A WHOLE!!!

FOOTBALL GAMES

The BOSS is required to perform at all home varsity football games. The band and colorguard play an important role at our football games. While sitting in the stands these guidelines will be followed:

- 1. Sit in sections and do not move about during the game.
- 2. Playing is only permitted when the band is performing as a unit.
- 3. Only uniformed personnel will be allowed to sit in the band and colorguard sections. Exceptions may be made for band/colorguard graduates and special guests of the directors.
- 4. Listen for instructions and watch the director at all times!

TRANSPORTATION/TRIPS

- 1) All students must ride on the bus to and from any event where transportation is provided. Any arrangements contrary to this MUST be approved by Mr. Dudek, Mr. Gangemi or Ms. Keys.
- 2) All students MUST turn in a transportation permit form prior to riding the bus.
- 3) Students will NOT be allowed to switch buses without the permission of *Mr. Dudek, Mr. Gangemi or Ms. Keys.*
- 4) Please arrange for student pickup within 15 minutes of our return to Santiago.
- 5) Parent pick-up at the site of an off-campus event should be only under special circumstances, not all season long. Santiago High School promotes riding on the bus to and from all events where transportation is provided as part of group unity. In addition, upon returning to campus students have tasks that include unloading of buses, trucks, trailers along with cleaning and returning all equipment to its proper place, etc. If your student is to be picked up from an off-campus event it is their responsibility to make sure that their equipment or specific task is taken care of.
- 6) An *Off-Campus Event Bus Release Request form* must be completed and submitted three (3) days prior to an event in order for a parent/guardian to transport their student from a band or colorguard event. Only the parent/guardian of the student may pick-up the student. See form attached in this packet.

BAND UNIFORMS

Each band member will be assigned a uniform consisting of a coat, a pair of pants, a hat, a plume and marching shoes. Each band member will receive a regulation band T-shirt to be worn underneath the uniform coat. Sleeveless shirts may not be worn underneath the uniform, as they offer no protection against perspiration stains. The care of the uniform is of the utmost importance. Each student is financially responsible for maintaining the good condition of his/her uniform. The student will be financially responsible for any damage or loss of their assigned uniform (replacement cost is \$400.00 per uniform). These rules must be followed at all times:

- 1) There will be no eating or drinking while in uniform, except for water and food distributed by the band boosters.
- 2) All cleaning will be done through the boosters. No other cleaning will be allowed. If a uniform must be cleaned due to the negligence or carelessness of a student, the student will be charged for the cleaning.
- 3) Uniforms will be properly kept on the hanger when not in use.
- 4) Hats will be in the box when not in use.
- 5) Plumes will be handled only by assigned boosters and/or students.
- 6) It is the student's responsibility to keep his/her shoes polished and cleaned.

The personal grooming of each student is vital to the appearance of the entire group, as well as our success at competitions. S.C.S.B.O.A. has strict rules in this area. These rules are:

- 1) No jewelry is to be worn, except that which is a designated part of the uniform.
- 2) Hair must be above the collar, except as designated for the uniform.
- 3) No make-up or fingernail polish is to be worn, except as designated for the uniform.

REMEMBER: <u>Uniformity</u> is the basis for judging in all marching band eventsiiii

BAND UNIFORMS, cont.

In addition to the uniform purchased by the boosters, each <u>BAND</u> member must furnish the following personal items.

- 1) Crew/or mid-calf solid **black** socks
- 2) A pair of black gym shorts to be worn underneath the uniform pants.

In addition to the uniform purchased by the boosters, each <u>COLORGUARD</u> member must furnish the following personal items.

- 1) Winter Guard Jazz Shoes
- 2) Undergarments/unitard
- 3) Make-up & accessories

Students not possessing the above items will be considered out of uniform. The uniform will be checked out and checked in by parents. There will be an inspection before each marching band appearance to ensure that all uniform and grooming rules have been followed. Students that fail inspection will not be allowed to perform, which will result in a lower grade for the quarter.

An inspection will also be held as the uniforms are turned in. This inspection will check for:

- 1) Correctly hung pants and coat
- 2) Fastened coat
- 3) Corresponding uniform numbers to bags.
- 4) Corresponding hat numbers to boxes.

No uniform will be accepted until it passes inspection. No students will be permitted to leave the band room until the uniform is properly checked in.

PRIVATE LESSONS/HONOR BANDS

Although as much individual help as possible is provided during rehearsals, each member is strongly encouraged to study with a private teacher who is a specialist on that student's instrument. Such a teacher is able to devote the entire lesson time to helping the student to solve individual playing problems. Through private lessons students can advance much faster musically. Also, private study allows students to prepare solo literature necessary for solo and ensemble festivals, the S.C.S.B.O.A. Southern California Honor Band, C.B.D.A. All-State Band, CMEA All-State, RCC honor bands, etc. These and other honor bands allow students to grow musically and improve the bands at Santiago High School. The Santiago Band is providing an opportunity to receive private instruction from highly qualified teachers after school and at our campus. Interested parents/students should contact the band directors for further information.

SCHOOL INSTRUMENTS

Santiago High School owns a limited number of musical instruments. Large instruments such as bass clarinets, baritones, tubas, and some percussion instruments will be available for students. Students who are entrusted with a school instrument are required to fill out an instrument loan contract, which holds her/him responsible for the care and safety of that instrument. If an instrument needs to be repaired or replaced due to improper use, it will be at the student's expense. Students are to purchase their own mouthpieces for brass and woodwind instruments and heads for marching percussion.

GRADING POLICY

Band and Colorguard students are graded according to a point system. Students gain points for performances, after school rehearsals, practice records, weekly quizzes and tests, and classroom participation. The point values are as follows:

(includes band classroom materials – 3-ring binder, spiral notebook, pencil and pencil pouch, page protectors)

Students will be penalized a minimum of 20 points for tardiness and/or failure to dress appropriately for a performance.

Students will be penalized 5 points for tardiness and/or lack of preparation for a rehearsal.

In addition to the point system, remember that <u>all</u> aspects of the student's performance including preparation, punctuality, effort, and cooperation will be taken into consideration in determining a final grade.

LETTERING

A student will be eligible for a letter when the following criteria are met:

- 1) Successful completion of Four (4) consecutive semesters of Marching Band and/or Concert Band and/or Symphonic Band and/or Festival Winds and/or Colorguard.
- 2) Achievement of a minimum grade of "B" for each class that is used for letter eligibility.
- 3) No unexcused absences from performances during semesters used for eligibility.

LETTERING cont.

A letter may be denied if:

- 1) Any of the above criteria has not been met.
- 2) The student has a negative account balance or owes the band or colorguard money or materials.
- 3) The student is suspended from school due to a behavior problem at a band or colorguard function.
- 4) A student has severe discipline problems.

AWARDS Partial List

Concert Player of the Year- awarded to the student recognized for superior musicianship, musical achievement, leadership, dependability, loyalty, and cooperation—in short, the qualities that directors strive to develop in all students.

Jazz Player of the Year- awarded to the jazz band member who demonstrates superior musicianship, musical achievement, leadership and dependability in the area of jazz music.

Marching Player of the Year- awarded to the band member who demonstrates leadership, maturity, excellent marching skills, and is respected by students and staff.

Outstanding Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, Senior – awarded to the students who demonstrate superior musicianship, musical achievement and a desire to improve the Santiago Band.

Colorguard Rookie of the Year- awarded to the first-year student recognized for superior ability, leadership, dependability, loyalty, and cooperation.

Colorguard Most Improved- awarded to the colorguard student who has shown the greatest improvement in ability, dependability and attitude

Colorguard Outstanding Performer- awarded to the colorguard member who demonstrates leadership, maturity, excellent performance skills, and is respected by students and staff.

MVP (Most Valuable Player) – will be awarded to the students who further their dedication to the band or colorguard organization by their participation in class, performances, private lessons and/or county, regional, or state honor bands.

Senior 4 year Medallions – will be awarded to seniors who complete four full years of band or colorguard.
